You will see:

- A huge collection of WWII historic vehicles
- Original WWII warbirds (some flying)
- A large reenactment event with encampment and battles
- Antique cars and a variety of displays for ALL interests!

Details

Date: Sunday, October 8, 2017

Cost: \$45 per member and member can bring one guest at this price; non-members other than guest are \$50. This **INCLUDES** bus ticket, driver tip, and admission to the show.

Times: Bus will be picking up at three locations on the 8th.

Schoharie Park & Ride off I-88 at 5:30am

Altamont at about 117 Maple Avenue across from public parking lot at 6:00am

Crossgates Mall behind Petsmart at 6:30am


